Program Information for International Students

SWU offers 2 non-degree semester programs for international students, depending on their Japanese language level.

Intensive Japanese Language Program

Program Feature

- Intermediate Level (JLPT N3 or CEFR A2 level).

- One semester (15 weeks) program offered in both Spring (Apr-Jul) and Fall (Oct-Feb) semester.
- 3 mandatory language course worth 8 credits (10,800 min) plus 2 extra liberal arts courses worth 2 credits per course (some 1 credit). (about 10 courses conducted in English will be available each semester)
