- A paper size A4, text size 2 cm on either side of the page, line spacing "1.15", font type "Arial", font height "12", MS Word, no grammatical or technical problems, 5-8 pages
- Citations, footnotes, and explanations of sources must be written clearly and without infringing on copyright or intellectual property rights.
- The paper should be included a topic of study, keywords, an abstract, a brief introduction of the speaker introduction, literature review, method, findings, discussion and conclusion, and references;
- Papers should be written in English;
- Presenter can attend the conference as an individual or in a group of two;
- The paper should be submitted with the author's academic degree, title, and position in it.

Paper Submission Deadline: Papers should be submitted until 23:50 p.m. May 10, 2024, via <u>tumen9bolor@gmail.com</u>. Late or unqualified submissions cannot be accepted.

Discussion: The top ten presentations will be selected from the submissions received, and each chosen speaker will have a designated time slot of 7 to 10 minutes to deliver their presentation in English.
